## From the Heidelberg Catechism (1563):

27 Q: What do you understand by the providence of God?

A: God's providence is his almighty and ever-present power (Jer 23:23-24; Acts 17:24-28), whereby, as with his hand, he still upholds heaven and earth and all creatures (Heb 1:3), and so rules them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and lean years, food and drink, health and sickness, prosperity and poverty (Jer 5:24; Ac 14:15-17; Jn 9:3; Pr 22:2), indeed, all things, come to us not by chance (Pr 16:33) but from his fatherly hand (Mt 10:29).

28 Q: How does it benefit us to know that God has created all things and still upholds them by his providence?

A: We can be patient in adversity (Job 1:21-22; Ps 39:10; Jas 1:3), thankful when things go well (Dt 8:10; 1Thes 5:18), and with a view to the future we can have a firm confidence in our faithful God and Father that nothing in creation shall separate us from his love (Ps 55:22; Rom 5:3-5; 8:38-39). For all creatures are so completely in God's hand that without his will they cannot so much as move (Job 1:12; 2:6; Pr 21:1; Ac 17:24-28).<sup>1</sup>
